In order to lessen the cost you might want to purchase your yarn soon and split it up to 6 ways. John goes on vacation in January so you might want to order soon.

Bring a lunch

The morning lecture is open to all who are interested in learning how to set up and weave this study in color. She will lecture in the morning, and for those who want to participate, you will make the warp for your scarf in the afternoon. At the end of the class you will have a three-yard warp in the colors of your horoscope chart ready to go on your loom using a 12-dent reed.

For those wanting to make a warp, you will need a color chart to work from. There is a charge of \$10 for the chart. You will need to send Anita your birth data prior to February 1st. She needs the following information: your name, birth date, birth place and birth time. Your birth certificate should have the information. If you were born in a large city, the hospital name is helpful. The fee will be collected on the day of class. Email contact alpazeian@comcast.net

Class supplies:

Warping board or reel



12 cones of 20/2 cotton (or any other fiber of similar weight) in the colors of the rainbow Cotton is suggested for the 1st scarf because it is easy to use.

red, red-orange, orange, yellow-orange, yellow, yellow-green, green, blue-green (turquoise), blue, indigo, purple, red-purple (magenta) Red Red #12

Village Spinning and Weaving colors: Red Red #12, Red-Orange Indies, Orange #114, Quince #128, Orange Light Orange #67, Yellow-Orange Gold #10, Yellow Light Yellow #40, Yellow-Green Bali #37,

Scarab Green #53, Persian Green #106, Green Sapphire Green 313, Kelly Green #97, Evergreen #8, Blue-Green Bermuda Blue #109, Mineral #95, Teal #110, Blue Pacific Blue #125, Indigo Denim #126, Paradise #105, Purple Grape #121, Red-Purple Wine Tone #73.

Choose the color you like within the color group - some like the warmer tones of a color, some like more pastel colors. I tend to use lime green for the yellow-green and some cannot live with that. Just pick the 12 colors that YOU like. Mini cones of 20/2 cotton can be purchased from Village Spinning and Weaving. You can also dye your threads in the 12 colors. You will need about 400 yards of each color.

Weft - 10/2 cotton or any fiber of similar weight - We will discuss color in class. You do not need this for the class. If you decide to use a neutral weft color (black or grey), bring a small amount of 20/2 in that color for the scarf edges. This allows the weft to disappear at the edge.

Gold metallic yarn - If you don't have this, don't buy it. I will bring a giant cone of machine embroidery metallic that you can use. It works great.

Scissors Waste yarn for tie-offs Pen and paper

NOTE: Because of yarn cost concerns, the group can buy and share the cones. Each person will need about 400 yards of each color - some colors require a little more, some a little less. If everyone is going to make

warps at the workshop, you will need to wind off so everyone has their own 12 colors to work with. If there are dyers in the group, they could dye their different color variations using different percentages for the colors they prefer. If everyone uses the same color threads, the only variations will be their weft colors. The scarves will still look different, but the color qualities/intensities will be the same.
