- I. Call to Order: President Julie M called the meeting to order at 10:04 am.

- III. Minutes: The minutes for the June meeting moved to accept with no corrections. Charlotte P motioned and Nikki C seconded; the minutes were approved.

However, with Show and Sale booth rentals and the silent auctions, we have an ending balance of \$12,041. Karen B motioned to accept the Treasurer's Report with Nikki C as a second. A. Tulare County Fair: We reached out to the fair to inquire about demonstrating. She also tried to suggest changes to make the weaving and spinning categories easier for people to enter but did not have any luck this year.

Nikki was asked to weave placemats to match a friend's dish set, and after she had started working, the friend bought new dishes. Monica showed off her pile of yarn and roving she

solar dyed during the extreme heat wave. She and DeeDee explained their individual process for solar dyeing. Tom finished his tables runner and started his first set of dish towels. They turned out too small, but he's going to keep them and perhaps use them as beautiful napkins. Hannah brought out a Baltic pickup mushroom key fob that she made for her sister and a hummingbird band inspired by some of Sophie's fiber.
