Recently, I've done a three color pick up strap for my new purse (I've previously only done two color and plain weave on my inkle loom). About 20 years ago I made a couple of socks-they were done top down, and I guit after a couple of pairs when I got to the toe of a sock and didn't have enough yarn to finish. At the request of a cousin who to whom I owe a favor, I'm re-learning how to make them. The pattern I've chosen is toe up, and I am doing two at a time on a magic loop, so that if I run out of yarn, I can just put a new yarn at the top of the sock and pretend like it was a design choice. I've even made some improvements to the pattern! Soon I should be able to weave again (I have been on a weaving hiatus due to back surgery). A while back I had seen some rep weave mats made with fabric and seagrass. I'm not a big fan of

For the rest of you reading this, the new year is about to begin. After having tried several new things this year, I highly recommend it. It has been stimulating and enjoyable. It wasn't the safe, same old thing (even though I do enjoy the safe, same old thing!).


